Go forth and rock out, you dog.

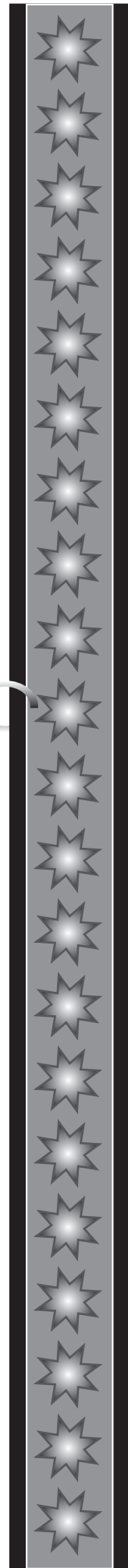
